- 16 500 Open Access articles yearly
- Administrated by the National Library of Sweden


The National Library of Sweden shall **promote** and **coordinate** the work of introducing open access to scholarly publications.




Open Access article share in hybrid journals






Agreement – Old Prices






Institutional- Unbalanced price distribution



Bibsam Consortium Action Plan

...the Consortium should not sign agreements for reading and publishing in so-called hybrid journals, and instead only negotiate for publication in open access journals; this approach should be implemented from 2026 and apply to all open journals, regardless of publisher...
