Ensure that publicly-funded research is available for social innovation, for improving the human condition.

Building global citizenship through the engagement of multiple publics in the social construction of scientific knowledge.



4. Scholarly Publishing

Scholarly publishing is key to the democratisation of knowledge.

Professional and social confidence in processes of knowledge generation.

Confidence in the knowledge that is produced.

Even more important in the context of rapid expansion and growing diversity in research outputs.

Create publishing systems that do not hinder access to knowledge.
