









Dutch ambition for open access



100% gold open access by 2020








Going for gold requires a properly thought-out and well organised negotiation.





Partial agreement: two years open access for 20% of published articles. Big deal: with 100% open access 2017 - 2019


Springer

Big deal: two years 100% open-access articles. Latest update: after one year's extension in 2017 the big deal with 100% open access continues in 2018 – 2021 July 2015

Big deal: two years 100% open-access articles.

Big deal: two years 100% openaccess articles. Latest update: Early 2018 an agreement on the main issues was established, extending the current agreement for another three years








TREND OPEN ACCESS ARTICLES TOP 7 PUBLISHERS AND RELATED COSTS
